



WHITE LODGE GOLF CLUB - LADIES SECTION ADMISSION PROCEDURES for NEW MEMBERS

1. Candidates should fill in an Application Form and submit this to the White Lodge Ladies Secretary.
 - **Handicap Holders** will be invited to play a minimum of one game of 18 holes with a Committee member.
 - Both players should sign the card(s) - which will be submitted to the Handicap Secretary together with the Handicap Certificate or CDH number
 - Applicants will then be invited to meet the Captain and their application will be considered by the Committee.
 - **Non Handicap Holders** will be invited to play **54 holes** made up from a combination of 18 or 9 hole games, one of which will be with a Committee Member. If introduced by a member, one game will normally be with the introducing member.
 - Non Handicap holders will be asked to complete their rounds on either of the two courses and have a basic understanding of golf rules and etiquette.
 - All three cards should be signed by both players and the cards will be submitted to the Handicap Secretary who will arrange for a handicap to be awarded and for the application to be considered by the Committee.
2. Once the application has been considered and approved by the Committee, applicants will be invited to submit their Annual Subscription. The current Annual Subscription is £90. (This can be reduced to £40 if joining between 01 August and 31 October and to £20 if joining from 01 November.)
3. When the fee has been received by the Treasurer, applicants are eligible to play in club competitions.
4. We also encourage you to take out a 1month or 12 month Loyalty membership with Glendale to cover your Green Fees. <https://www.glendalegolf.co.uk/richmond-park-golf-course/>

Competitions are held on Tuesdays but informal games, organized using a WhatsApp group, take place on Thursdays – when it is anticipated that most introductory games can be arranged.
